




What I Need to Know


The more you read, the more you learn. The more you learn the more reactions you can give. Most of the time, you give reactions to the story you've read and to the elements of the story as well especially the characters.

What's In




What is It


What is a **<u>reaction</u>**?

In giving reactions, one should put first himself/ herself to the situation embedded with emotions. You cannot give reactions without emotions on it. On the next page is an example.





Zarie asked his grandfather if she can be an animal volunteer. Her Grandpa permitted her and he even volunteered to be an animal volunteer also.


Ms. Joyce thanked Zarie and her grandfather for the good deed they have done.




Without much hesitation, she accepts being a volunteer teacher on the Literacy Program. The barangay officials leave her house happily.

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
